1. NAME OF THE VETERINARY MEDICINAL PRODUCT

Easimax Plus Tablets

2. STATEMENT OF ACTIVE SUBSTANCES

50 mg/tablet Praziquantel, 50 mg/tablet Pyrantel (equivalent to 144 mg pyrantel embonate) and 150 mg/tablet Febantel.

4. TARGET SPECIES

Dogs.

5. INDICATIONS

For products not subject to veterinary prescription:

Treatment of mixed infections by nematodes and cestodes.

6. ROUTES OF ADMINISTRATION

Oral use.

1 tablet per 10 kg bodyweight.

The tablets can be given directly to the dog or disguised in food.

7. WITHDRAWAL PERIODS

Discard any unused divided tablets immediately.

Each tablet contains 50 mg Praziquantel, 50 mg Pyrantel (equivalent to 144 mg pyrantel embonate) and 150 mg Febantel.

PACKAGE LEAFLET

1. Name of the veterinary medicinal product

Easimax Plus Tablets For Dogs

2. Composition

Each tablet contains Praziquantel 50 mg, 50 mg Pyrantel (equivalent to 144 mg Pyrantel Embonate) and Febantel 150 mg.

The veterinary medicinal product is a pale yellow tablet with a cross breakline on one side.

The tablets can be divided into 2 or 4 equal parts.

3. Target species

Dogs.

4. Indications for use

Treatment of mixed infections by nematodes and cestodes of the following species

Nematodes:

Ascarids: *Toxocara canis*, *Toxascaris leonina* (adult and late immature forms).

Hookworms: *Uncinaria stenocephala*, *Ancylostoma caninum* (adults).

Whipworms: *Trichuris vulpis* (adults).

Cestodes:

Tapeworms: *Echinococcus species* (*E. granulosus*, *E. multilocularis*), *Taenia species*

(*T. hydatigena*, *T. pisiformis*, *T. taeniformis*), *Dipylidium caninum* (adult and immature forms).

5. Contraindications

Do not use simultaneously with piperazine compounds.

Do not use in cases of hypersensitivity to the active substances or to any of the excipients.

6. Special warnings

Special warnings:

Fleas serve as intermediate hosts for one common type of tapeworm – *Dipylidium caninum*.

Tapeworm infestation is certain to re-occur unless control of intermediate hosts such as fleas, mice etc. is undertaken.

Tapeworm infestation is unlikely in pups less than 6 weeks of age.

Parasite resistance to any particular class of anthelmintic may develop following frequent, repeated use of an anthelmintic of that class.

Unnecessary use of antiparasitics or use deviating from the instructions given in the SPC may increase the resistance selection pressure and lead to reduced efficacy. The decision to use the product should be based on confirmation of the parasitic species and burden, or of the risk of infection based on its epidemiological features, for each individual animal.

In the absence of risk of co-infection with nematodes or cestodes, a narrow spectrum product should be used.

The possibility that other animals in the same household can be a source of re-infection with nematodes and cestodes should be considered, and these should be treated as necessary with an appropriate product.

Special precautions to be taken by the person administering the veterinary medicinal product to animals:

In case of accidental ingestion, seek medical advice immediately and show the package leaflet or the label to the physician.

In the interests of good hygiene, persons administering the tablets directly to the dog, or by adding them to the dog's food, should wash their hands afterwards.

For animal treatment only.

Pregnancy:

Teratogenic effects attributed to high doses of febantel have been reported in sheep and rats. No studies have been performed in dogs during early pregnancy. Use of the veterinary medicinal product during pregnancy should be in accordance with a benefit risk assessment by the responsible veterinarian. The use is not recommended during the first 4 weeks of pregnancy in dogs. Do not exceed the stated dose when treating pregnant bitches.

Interactions with other medicinal products and other forms of interaction:

Do not use simultaneously with piperazine compounds as the anthelmintic effects of pyrantel and piperazine may be antagonised.

Concurrent use with other cholinergic compounds (e.g.foxim) can lead to toxicity. If you are uncertain, and your dog uses other veterinary medicinal products, check with a veterinary surgeon or pharmacist.

Overdose:

The combination of praziquantel, pyrantel embonate and febantel is well tolerated in dogs. In safety studies, a single dose of 5 times the recommended dose or greater gave rise to occasional vomiting.

Other precautions:

Echinococcosis represents a hazard for humans. As echinococcosis is a notifiable disease to the World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE), specific guidelines on the treatment and follow-up, and on the safeguard of persons, need to be obtained from the relevant competent authority.

7. Adverse events

Dogs:

Very rare (<1 animal / 10,000 animals treated, including isolated reports):	Digestive tract disorders (diarrhoea, emesis)
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Reporting adverse events is important. It allows continuous safety monitoring of a product. If you notice any side effects, even those not already listed in this package leaflet, or you think that the medicine has not worked, please contact, in the first instance, your veterinarian. You can also report any adverse events to the marketing authorisation holder or the local representative of the marketing authorisation holder using the contact details at the end of this leaflet, or via your national reporting system.

8. Dosage for each species, routes and method of administration

Oral use.

The recommended dose rates are: 15 mg/kg bodyweight febantel, 5 mg/kg pyrantel (equivalent to 14.4 mg/kg pyrantel embonate) and 5 mg/kg praziquantel.

1 tablet per 10 kg (22 lbs) bodyweight. The tablets can be given directly to the dog or disguised in food. No starvation is needed before, or after, treatment.

The tablet can be divided in two or four equal parts.

Underdosing could result in ineffective use and may favour resistance development.

9. Advice on correct administration

To ensure a correct dosage, body weight should be determined as accurately as possible.

10. Withdrawal periods

Not applicable.

11. Special storage precautions

Keep out of the sight and reach of children.

This veterinary medicinal product does not require any special storage conditions.

Do not use this veterinary medicinal product after the expiry date which is stated on the label after EXP. The expiry date refers to the last day of that month.

Discard any unused divided tablets immediately.

12. Special precautions for disposal

Medicines should not be disposed of via wastewater.

Use take-back schemes for the disposal of any unused veterinary medicinal product or waste materials derived thereof in accordance with local requirements and with any applicable national collection systems. These measures should help to protect the environment.

Ask your veterinary surgeon or pharmacist how to dispose of medicines no longer required.

13. Classification of veterinary medicinal products

IE, UK, EE, RO, LU, IT, LT, LV, NL: Veterinary medicinal product not subject to prescription.

The veterinary medicinal product is presented in either:

Individual strips composed of aluminium foil 30 µm/30 gsm extruded polythene, containing 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14, 16, 18 or 20 tablets.

or

Individual blisters composed of 45 µm, soft temper aluminium foil and 25 µm hard temper aluminium foil, containing 2 or 8 tablets.

The strips or blisters are packed into cartons containing either 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14, 16, 18, 20, 24, 28, 30, 32, 36, 40, 42, 44, 48, 50, 52, 56, 60, 70, 80, 84, 90, 98, 100, 104, 106, 120, 140, 150, 180, 200, 204, 206, 250, 280, 300, 500 or 1000 tablets.

Not all pack sizes may be marketed.
