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I. SCIENTIFIC OVERVIEW

The quality / safety / efficacy aspects of this product is/are identical to Dysect Sheep Pour-on Alphacypermethrin 12.5 g/l Pour-on Solution. The initial application for Dysect Sheep Pour-on Alphacypermethrin 12.5 g/l Pour-on Solution was assessed before there was a requirement to have a public assessment report, therefore no details in this section are available.
