6. INDICATION(S)

Easy to use
Kills Tapeworm, Roundworm and Hookworm in a single dose
Johnson's One Dose Wormer for Dogs 500mg is a broad spectrum anthelmintic for use in adult dogs for treatment of the following roundworms and tapeworms: Roundworms: *Toxocara canis*, *Toxascaris leonina*, *Uncinaria stenocephala*, *Ancylostoma caninum*. Tapeworms: *Taenia hydatigena*, *Taenia pisiformis*, and *Dipylidium caninum*.

7. METHOD AND ROUTE(S) OF ADMINISTRATION

Read the package leaflet before use

Directions for Use:

Give the required number of tablets first thing in the morning when your dog's stomach is empty, with about one fifth of his daily food ration. The tablets should be given whole. This product can be an irritant to the skin and eyes. Tablets are film-coated and should not be broken or divided. To reduce the risk of vomiting, it is

recommended that the remaining food ration is withheld for eight hours after the wormer dose.

Dosage: The dose of the product for the treatment of small dogs and puppies is 1 x 100 mg tablet per 2 kg (4.4 lb) bodyweight. Puppies should be dosed at 12, 16 and 24 weeks. An alternative worming product must be used in younger puppies. For adult dogs repeat this treatment every three to six months as a preventative measure.

Follow the dosage chart below:

For dogs weighing more than 8 kg (17.6 lb), use Johnson's One Dose Wormer for Dogs 500mg Film-Coated Tablets

9. SPECIAL WARNING(S), IF NECESSARY

Read the package leaflet before use.

CONTRAINDICATIONS

Do not use in dogs weighing less than 2 kg.

The product should not be administered to puppies less than 12 weeks old, owing to the need to restrict food intake at the time of administration.

When administered as recommended, the product is unlikely to cause vomiting. However, if vomiting does occur after treatment, do not repeat the dose. Do not administer if your dog is sick or recovering from an illness.

Do not use in dogs with a known allergy (hypersensitivity) to nitroscanate or any of the other ingredients (excipients). If a hypersensitivity or any other adverse reaction does occur, cease treatment. If signs of disease persist or appear, consult your veterinary surgeon.

Tablets are film-coated and should not be broken or divided.

3. STATEMENT OF THE ACTIVE SUBSTANCE(S) AND OTHER INGREDIENT(S)

Each tablet contains Nitroscanate 100 mg.
Smooth yellow coloured film coated tablets, convex shaped (plain round concave)

4. INDICATION(S)

The product is a broad spectrum anthelmintic for use in puppies and adult dogs for the treatment of the following nematodes (roundworms) and cestodes (tapeworms): :
Nematodes: *Toxocara canis*, *Toxascaris leonina*, *Uncinaria stenocephala*, *Ancylostoma caninum*
Cestodes: *Taenia hydatigena*, *Taenia pisiformis*, and *Dipylidium caninum*.

5. CONTRAINDICATIONS

Do not use in dogs weighing less than 2 kg. Do not repeat treatment if vomiting occurs shortly after dosing. Do not administer if your pet is sick or recovering from an illness. Do not use in known cases of allergy (hypersensitivity) to the active substance nitroscanate or to any of the other ingredients (excipients). If a hypersensitivity or any other adverse reaction occurs, treatment with the product should be discontinued.

6. ADVERSE REACTIONS

During the post-marketing surveillance, transient gastrointestinal signs (vomiting and diarrhoea); systemic sign (lethargy) and neurological sign (ataxia) have been observed very rarely.

The frequency of adverse reactions is defined using the following convention:

- very common (more than 1 in 10 animals treated displaying adverse reaction(s))
- common (more than 1 but less than 10 animals in 100 animals treated)
- uncommon (more than 1 but less than 10 animals in 1,000 animals treated)
- rare (more than 1 but less than 10 animals in 10,000 animals treated)
- very rare (less than 1 animal in 10,000 animals treated, including isolated reports).

For smaller dogs and puppies

8. DOSAGE FOR EACH SPECIES, ROUTE(S) AND METHOD OF ADMINISTRATION

Give the required number of tablets first thing in the morning when your dog's stomach is empty, with about one fifth of his daily food ration. The tablets should be given whole. Tablets are film coated and should not be broken or divided. To reduce the risk of vomiting, it is recommended that the remaining food ration is withheld for eight hours after the wormer dose.

The dose of the product for the treatment of small dogs and puppies is 1 x 100 mg tablet per 2 kg (4.4 lb) of bodyweight. The product should not be administered to puppies less than 12 weeks old, owing to the need to restrict food intake at the time of administration.

Follow the dosage chart below:

2.1 - 4 kg (4.5 - 8.8 lb)	Miniature	Two
4.1 - 6 kg (8.9 - 13.2 lb)	Dachshund	Three
6.1 - 8 kg (13.3 - 17.6 lb)	Miniature Poodle West Highland Terrier	Four

For dogs weighing more than 8 kg (17.6 lb), use Johnson's One Dose Wormer for Dogs 500mg Film-Coated Tablets.

9. ADVICE ON CORRECT ADMINISTRATION

The product when administered as recommended is unlikely to cause vomiting. Do not repeat treatment if vomiting occurs shortly after dosing.

10. WITHDRAWAL PERIOD

11. SPECIAL STORAGE PRECAUTIONS

Keep out of the sight and reach of children.

Store in a dry place. Do not store above 25°C.

Do not use this veterinary medicinal product after the expiry date which is stated on the label after EXP. The expiry date refers to the last day of that month. Keep blister strips in outer carton

12. SPECIAL WARNING(S)

i) The product is not indicated for the treatment of *Trichuris vulpis*

ii) It is recommended that adult dogs should be wormed routinely 2 - 4 times a year. Since the most common tapeworm of the dog (*Dipylidium caninum*) is transmitted by a flea and has a very short pre-patent period, it is important to pay attention to flea control to reduce the incidence of tapeworm in your pet.

iii) It is important to worm young puppies very regularly for roundworm with a suitable product. Johnson's One Dose Wormer for Puppies & Small Dogs 100mg Film-Coated Tablets can be used at 12, 16, and 24 weeks of age. An alternative worming product must be used in younger puppies. Nursing bitches should be treated at 2, 4, 6, 8 and 12 weeks after whelping.. Thereafter the adult worming regime of 2 - 4 times a year is recommended.

iv) If symptoms of disease persist or appear, consult your veterinary surgeon.

Can be used safely during pregnancy and lactation.

This product can be an irritant to the skin and eyes. Tablets are film-coated and should not be broken or divided.


