I. SCIENTIFIC OVERVIEW

The quality / safety / efficacy aspects of this product is/are identical to Lanodip 4:1, 2.82% w/v, Concentrate for Teat Dip / Teat Spray Solution. The initial application for Lanodip 4:1, 2.82% w/v, Concentrate for Teat Dip / Teat Spray Solution was assessed before there was a requirement to have a public assessment report, therefore no details in this section are available.
